1662

On 5 May Thomas Nevill granted licence to let The Green Dragon to William Winch for 21 years

1682

Ellen Braint surr to Green Dragon to Edward Braint

1699

Robert Holmes surr "all that two messuages called The Green Dragon . formerly the Hermitage in Whetstone, in the occupation of Gabriel Sleath to R Edwards

1729

Thomas Holmes surr the Green Dragon to Kathleen Holmes

1751

Thomas Holmes (adm 1729) surr a cottage called The Green Dragon to Catherine Holmes

1760

Catherine Holmes surr The Green Dragon to John Toone who surr it to William Roberts

1768

Be it remembered that in 1760 William Roberst, who, on the surr of John Toone, was adm to The Green Dragon, surr the same to Thomas Earp

1794

William Earp, son and heir of Thomas Earp (1763) adm to The Green Dragon

1804

William and Elizabeth Earp surr two mess in occ of Anne Miller and John Dean, formerly known as The Green Dragon

1817

William Woodward dead, two mess in occ of Anne Miller and James Dean, formerly one house called The Green Dragon surr to C Ellis (adm 1804)

1820

William Woodward, dead, his son and heir Edward Woodward, butcher, surr The Green Dragon to William Todd

1824

William Todd and Mary his wife purchased for the sum of £860 from the trustees of William Woodward all the mess togerher with a butcher's shop, cowhouse and other buildings and

orchard and 2 closes called Home Close and Further Home Close of 6 acres. 2r together formerly called The Green Dragon
