### **1748**

Mary Farwell adm to the Green Manor (sic) on surr of her husband Richard Farwell

### **1751**

Edward Burton adm Green Man on surr of Mary Farwell

### **1765**

Middlesex Petty Sessions: Simon Goodman bound servant to Robert Bellams at the Green Man, Whetstone. Wages £3 3s 0d per year as from Sept 1764

### **1800**

Bissett Burton dead, surr the Green Man (formerly the Red Lyon) to Edward Burton

### **1801**

Burton (adm 15 June 1751) surr Green Man to Edmund Burton his brother and heir

### **1803**

E Burton to C Ellis by Burton's will

### **1822**

William Ellis surr Green Man to his nephew John Ellis

### **1829**

The Green Man and 5 acres surr to John Ellis under the will of his uncle Charles Ellis

### **1830**

Building refronted, presumably by Ellis

### **1832**

John Ellis surr Green Man to ? Halford

### **1837**

Licensed Victuallers Return: Ann Fulwood shown as Green Man

Unlisted map of Green Man site, probably about 1890. It shows public house, stables, skittle alley all belonging to Watney, Coombe & Reid. Then a field London & South West Bank with pond just to east behind bank. Athenaeum Road named as such
