Thomas Sanny surr Blackwell Field and a cottage and garden to John Sanny

1549 (2 Edward VI)

John Sanny surr a cottage called Bakehouse, a field of pasture and mead, Blackwell Field of 8½ acres, a cottage and garden which he lately built and a tenement and barn to Robert Sanny his son and heir

1587 (29 Elizabeth)

Robert Sanny surr the mess in which he lives to William Sanny

1603 (1 James I)

William Sanny surr the mess in which he lives and another cottage in occ of Thomas Atkins to Nicholas Kempe of the Middle temple

1693

Ffaith, wife of Henry Kempe, adm to three tens and a close of 2 acres by will. She was lately wife of Ed Brent and is admitted under his will

1696

William Sherton surr to Andrew Garland a mess or ten divided into three and two acres

1700

William Garland adm to be a customary tenant of the Manor of 3 mess now 2 and a close of 2 acres on the surr of Andrew Garland who died in 1696

1718

Benjamin Turbutt adm to 3 mess formerly one on surr of W Garland

1725

Benjamin Turbutt adm to 3 mess on death of his father Benjamin Turbutt

1739

R Brown adm to 3 mess now one and 2 acres of land on surr of R Turbutt

Richard Brown dead. Richard Broen surr three mess now one and a close of land of 2 acres to Richard Brown is son and heir. had rented it to Robert Turutt at a yearly rent of £13

1744

Richard Brown dead. He surr to Elizabeth Sandys his sister, a mess with appurtenances and gardens and a close of 2 acres to which he was adm in 1739 on surr of Henry Kemp

1783

Samuel Sandys surr the Griffin and a cottage adjoining in the occ Widow H

1790

William Nixon surr the griffin to Anne Nixon

1813

Anne Nixon dead, property by will to her daughter Eliz Cole

1827

Lease between Thomas Arms of Prat Place, London and James Watkins of Whetstone, dated 17 August 1826, all that mess or ten in Whetstone called the Griffin with barns and stables attached and also to the east end or part of the garden of the same which was fenced or partitioned from the other part of the garden of the late Eliz Cole, and also of a small piece of ground behind the said premises of 1 acre 3r 3 p for rthe residue of the term of 21 years

1837

Eliz Cole dead. Griffin sold to Thomas Arms for £1050 then quickly to Meux the brewers

1857

Meux purchased "a cottage adjoining formerly in occ of Widow Hows and now of? Parker"
